- The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dave Grierson at 9:02 am.

**Approval of Minutes:**

- Minutes of the February 10, 2009 were approved as amended. Motion made by Kimm Harty, seconded by Rebecka Stromness.

**Reports from Agencies on Anticipated Projects:**

- Bob Clark noted this would be his last meeting as he is retiring.
- Rebecka Stromness reported she had been working on the Washington City Road Project and Mountain View Corridor. The Washington Fields Road will run from the Virgin River to Telegraph Road and involve 2 to 5 lanes. The Highway may, but is not expected to, adversely affect any species. Approximately 30 acres will be required for construction of the Mt. View Corridor. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) anticipates various projects statewide, which include pavement preservation, bridge rehabilitation, and replacement, local government projects, sidewalks and ADA ramps. UDOT is attempting to make Utah the first state to get projects completed so it can be first in line for the 2<sup>nd</sup> round of anticipated revenue disbursements.
- Kelly Beck thanked all for their assistance in providing projects to RDCC noting he would be contacting each member for suggestions on improvement of the RDCC initiative. He requested everyone send Judy Edwards approximate numbers of anticipated participants interested in the conflict management training.
- Carmen Bailey reported there is a management plan being required on every property that is owned by the DWR.
- Dottie Henderson reported there is an upcoming summit to discuss ideas and coordinating efforts to strengthen the economy.
- Ron Daniels reported he is working on the second part of the renewable energy resource phase.

- Mike Mower requested suggestions concerning legislation within the next 48 hours.
- David Grierson reported his department is involved in a variety of easements, with 10 new easements presented in the month of January alone The Galena Property Bill has passed the house and is being introduced to the Senate. A long term implementation framework for the Blueprint Jordan River work is being developed by a planning entity group. A large treatment plant is planned in South Jordan Valley which will cross the Jordan River twice.

**Other Business:**

- Bill Schlotthauer noted they will begin charging fees for stream alteration applications. Commercial ventures will be at a higher rate than others. Fees have not yet been determined.
